National Children's Center, Inc. (NCC) was founded in 1957 by families concerned about the lack of community services for children with developmental disabilities. Over 50 years later, NCC provides services and supports for people with developmental disabilities to grow and thrive throughout their life.

Every day, we serve more than 550 children and adults with developmental disabilities. NCC's early intervention services provide infants and toddlers access to therapies and other crucial services at an early age when they are still developing. At NCC's three special education schools (located in Northwest and Southeast Washington, DC and in Silver Spring, Maryland) students receive specialized instruction to increase their independence and prepare for the adult world of work. Adults with developmental disabilities learn, work and participate in their communities with the support of NCC's Employment Options and other services. NCC also maintains homes for children, adolescents and adults throughout Washington, DC and Maryland.

NCC values families and relationships and is always ready to meet the needs and desires of individuals with disabilities and their families through expanding its array of services. NCC is excited about its new Respitality program that supports families and caregivers of children and adults with developmental disabilities!

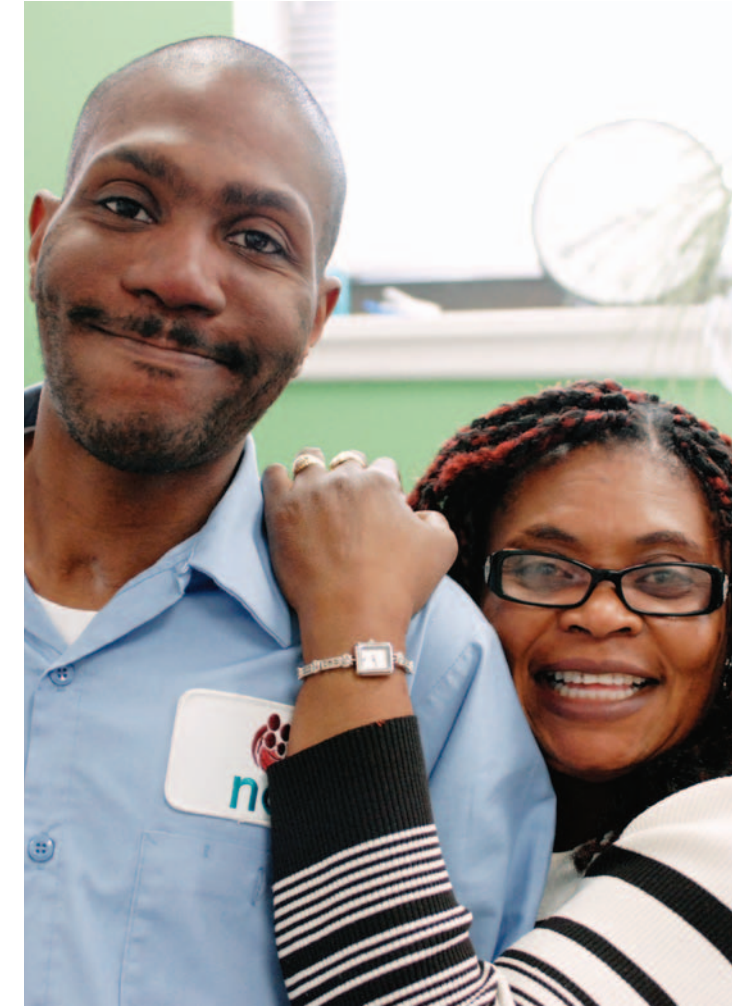
who we are

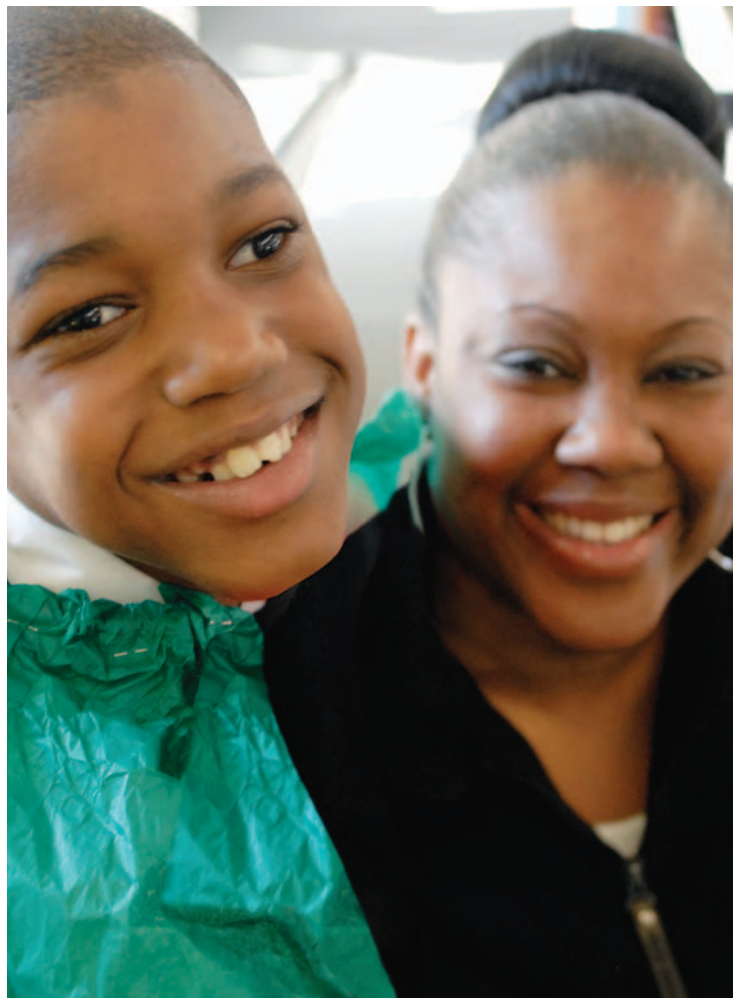

Do I have to pay for this service?

No. This service is completely free of charge.

Who will care for my loved one with a developmental disability while I am enjoying my night to relax?

You choose the person—a friend, neighbor, professional—to care for your loved one with a developmental disability. You will pay that person with a stipend from NCC.

I am a caregiver of a person with developmental disabilities, but I am not related to that person. Do I still qualify?

Yes. Respitality is for all primary caregivers.
