VR takes place in a safe and controlled environment, and provides a unique opportunity to engage in immersive simulations to explore new and existing interests.

With the support of different apps and software, VR can be especially helpful in goal progress. Through this approach towards personal goal attainment, persons supported will also build upon their ability to control technological devices. NCC is excited as we begin our pilot phases with VR. We are looking forward to a future that ignites passions, furthers understanding and knowledge, and engages people in savvy, forward-facing ways.

MEET IRIS

Iris is a veteran who has worked for NCC for the last 9 years. She is a Direct Support Professional (DSP), ensuring the health and well-being of Adult persons supported in our residential program. Iris is unique in that she herself is hearing impaired. As she attests, her "disability is a capability." Being a deaf-friendly DSP not only allows her to have a "meaningful and purposeful" career, but also enables her to operate with an intense level of empathy.

As a result of the pandemic, many of our DSPs left their families for weeks at a time to shelter in place with person's supported in their residential housing. They are truly our unsung heroes - Iris chief among them.

"People wanted to resume life as normal, but I had to encourage them to social distance, wear masks, and wash their hands." Iris provided companionship to people in need, taught deaf persons supported new words to communicate, and even found creative ways to help them exercise. "It was challenging but rewarding...it's an exciting time to be at NCC."

We're open for business in a COVIDsafe environment. Slots available for children 8 months to 12 years of age


